In 2021, we provided for, served, and empowered 924 children and youth which includes 571 answered crisis calls and a total of 9,999 total days of care across all programs. Your support helped clients find pathways to physical and emotional stability, reunification with families, or find permanent housing solutions early on to prevent a cycle of homelessness into adulthood.

City House counts on the generosity of the community in order to provide safe housing, counseling, and specialized services to help children cope with the multiple traumas they have experienced. 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



HOW WE SERVE



Emergency Sheller

Known as My Friend's House, our emergency shelter serves youth 0 to 17 who come to us through community referrals & CPS. The shelter provides:

- 24-hour care
- · Life skills classes & enrichment
- Medical, dental, & educational support
- Individual, family, & group therapy

Transitional Living

Designed to serve 18 to 22-year-olds, the Transitional Living Program provides a safe place for individuals to reside as we assist them in working toward long-term goals and living independently. Residents receive:

- Case management & therapy
- · Life skills classes & enrichment
- Academic & employment support



HOW WE SERVE

Street Ontreach

Our Street Outreach team connects with homeless youth where they are. The Youth Resource Center provides a place for individuals ages 16 - 22 to access:

- Case management & therapy
- New clothing & laundry services
- · Showers & meals
- Computer & Wi-Fi access






Connzeling

We offer free community counseling services with licensed therapists. These sessions aim to help families or individuals looking to stay in front of family challenges before they become runaway or homeless situations. We help with:

- At-risk behaviors
- Family & relationship conflict
- School concerns
- Self image, depression & anxiety

STORIES OF US

Antonio

Antonio is a 13-year-old boy who was removed from his family due to an unsafe environment and housing insecurity. He arrived at the shelter timid and afraid. Over time, he began to trust the staff and started to feel safe enough to begin sharing pieces of himself. During his time at the shelter, he was able to learn that there are adults who can be trusted and provide safety in his life.

Alyssa

Alyssa is a 13-year-old girl who was struggling at home. Her dad is deceased and her mom and stepdad fought frequently. Money was tight for the family and mom was not emotionally present for her daughter. Alyssa ran away and was on the street for 3 months. During this time, Alyssa was sexually assaulted several times. Both Alyssa and her mom came in for an assessment and agreed that our program would be a good fit. Upon completion of the program, Alyssa was ready to reunify with her mom.

Noah

Noah entered the program in March 2020 facing a long struggle with his mental health. He was a TLP resident for 14-months until he discharged in the spring of 2021. Noah left to attend college at Oklahoma State University. When we followed up with Noah and asked if he thought the services he received in the program were helpful he said, "I wouldn't be in college if it wasn't for City House."


